- Note the draft Six Cities 2050 Strategic Framework, comprising the visual summary maps entitled the Six Cities 2050 Vision, Six Cities 2050 Themes, and The Six Cities 2050 City Summaries.
- ii.) **Approve** that the Commission use the draft Six Cities 2050 Strategic Framework (as amended) to brief the incoming Planning Minister, MPs and senior government officials.
- iii.) **Note** the progress update on the development of the Region and City Plans including stakeholder engagement opportunities.

Item 5: Housing Target Design

Ms Anna Bardsley tabled for the Full Commission an update on the preparation of targets for housing supply for the Region Plan and City Plans and affordable housing targets on private and government-owned land.

The Committee discussed the associated costs of enabling infrastructure.

The Full Commission resolved to:

- i.) **Approve** the baseline year for the five, 10 and 20-year housing supply targets is 2024-25.
- ii.) **Approve** that the type of housing targets include is: five, 10 and 20-year targets for dwelling completions with supporting guidance provided on dwelling consents.
- iii.) **Note** the Commission is focused on ensuring that the affordable housing mechanisms address the barriers that have limited delivery over the past five years.
- iv.) **Note** the Commission will be undertaking targeted engagement with NSW Treasury and the key government land agencies to progress delivery of affordable and social housing on government-owned land.

Item 6: **Proposed Accelerated Housing Sites**

Ms Barker spoke to the report outlining the potential to identify accelerate housing sites (precincts) to help meet the National Housing Accord gap between housing supply and demand.

The Full Commission resolved:

i.) Endorse the progress and further action to be taken to identify and agree accelerated housing sites within the Six Cities to increase supply in 2024-29.

Item 7: Update on Workstreams -The Innovation District Ecosystem Approach

Ms Andren provided the Full Commission with an update on the Innovation Ecosystem including a methodology to identify innovation capable jobs analysis to visualise the research and development pipeline for emerging priority industries across the six cities.

The Full Commission resolved to note the work that is ongoing to support delivery of a globally competitive multi-city region including:

- a) focus on innovation capable jobs
- b) initial work around Research & Development pipeline visualisation and networks
